




A triangle is a shape with 3 straight sides...



and 3 corners.




This traffic sign is shaped like a triangle.




This part of the sail on a boat is shaped like a triangle.



If you cut a square piece of cheese in half, you get two triangles, one for you and one for a friend.




Triangles can be big.




Triangles can be little.
